Aurora, Nebraska November 25, 2008

A meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Aurora, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 7:30 p.m. on November 25, 2008 at the City Hall. Notice of meeting was simultaneously given to the Mayor and all members of the Council and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda of this meeting was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the Mayor and Council. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

7:35 P.M. PUBLIC HEARING:

Mayor Seeman opened the duly advertised public hearing to consider any written objections filed against the said proposed Street Improvement District No. 179, Madison Avenue. The Mayor asked if there were any written objections to the proposed Street Improvement District No. 179. There being no written objections the Mayor declared the public hearing closed.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Aurora, Nebraska as follows:

- The Mayor and City Council heretofore adopted on October 14, 2008 Ordinance No. 910 creating Street Improvement District No. 179, which ordinance was published as provided by law on October 22, 2008.
- Notice of Creation of said Street Improvement District was published as provided by law on October 29, November 5 and November 12, 2008 and notice was mailed to all nonresident owners as provided by law.
- 3. That objections were filed objecting to creation of Street Improvement District No. 179 as follows:

Written objections representing 0 front feet of abutting property were filed within 20 days of the first publication of the notice of creation of the District. That said Street Improvement District No. 179 contains a total of 492.69 front feet of abutting property and that the written objections representing 0 front feet of abutting property do not constitute a majority of the total front footage and the Mayor and Council may proceed with the construction of improvements in said District.

RESOLUTION 08-25

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Statutes of the State of Nebraska, including section 18-1736, the City of Aurora may designate parking spaces for the exclusive use of handicapped or disabled persons whose motor vehicles display the distinguishing license plates or permits;

WHEREAS, the City of Aurora has received a request to designate as parking spaces for the exclusive use of handicapped or disabled persons the following parking spaces: (1) the first parking space located on the West side of 12th Street North of the intersection with "M" Street; (2) the first parking space located on the South side of "M" Street West of the intersection with 12th Street; (3) the first parking space located on the West side of 12th Street South of the middle of the block between "M" Street and "L" Streets; (4) the first parking space located on the North side of "L" Street West of the intersection with 12th Street; (5) the first parking space located on the South side of "L" Street West of the intersection with 12th Street; (6) the first parking space located on the East side of 12th Street South of the intersection with "L" Street; (7) the first parking space located on the South side of "L" Street East of the middle of the block between 12th Street and 13th Streets: (8) the first parking space located on the West side of 13th St. Street South of the intersection with "L" Street; (9) the first parking space located on the East side of 13th Street South of the intersection with "L" Street; (10) the first parking space located on the North side of "L" Street East of the intersection with 13th Street; (11) the first parking space located on the East side of 13th Street North of the middle of the block between "M" Street and "L" Streets; (12) the first parking space located on the West side of 13th Street North of the intersection with "M" Street; and (13) the first parking space located on the North side of "M" Street West of the middle of the block between 12th and 13th Streets. Aurora, Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, after due consideration, the City of Aurora desires to designate the following parking spaces as parking spaces for the exclusive use of the handicapped or disabled persons: (1) the first parking space located on the West side of 12th Street North of the intersection with "M" Street; (2) the first parking space located on the South side of "M" Street West of the intersection with 12th Street; (3) the first parking space located on the West side of 12th Street South of the middle of the block between "M" Street and "L" Streets; (4) the first parking space located on the West side of 12th Street North of the intersection with "L" Street: (5) the first parking space located on the South side of "L" Street West of the intersection with 12th Street; (6) the first parking space located on the East side of 12th Street South of the intersection with "L" Street; (7) the first parking space located on the South side of "L" Street East of the middle of the block between 12th Street and 13th Streets: (8) the first parking space located on the South side of "L" Street West of the intersection with 13th Street; (9) the first parking space located on the West side of 13th Street North of the intersection with "K" Street; (10) the first parking space located on the East side of 13th Street South of the intersection with "L" Street; (11) the first parking space located on the North side of "L" Street East of the intersection with 13th Street; (12) the first parking space located on the East side of 13th Street North of the middle of the block between "M" Street and "L" Streets; (13) the first parking space located on the West side of 13th Street North of the intersection with "M" Street; and (14) the first parking space located on the North side of "M" Street West of the middle of the block between 12th and 13th Streets, Aurora, Nebraska.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the following parking spaces shall be designated handicapped or disabled persons parking spaces and shall be indicated by posting aboveground and immediately adjacent to and visible from such space a sign which is in conformance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices: (1) the first parking space located on the West side of 12th Street North of the intersection with "M" Street; (2) the first parking space located on the South side of "M" Street West of the intersection with 12th Street; (3) the first parking space located on the West side of 12th Street South of the middle of the block between "M" Street and "L" Streets; (4) the first parking space located on the West side of 12th Street North of the intersection with "L" Street: (5) the first parking space located on the South side of "L" Street West of the intersection with 12th Street; (6) the first parking space located on the East side of 12th Street South of the intersection with "L" Street; (7) the first parking space located on the South side of "L" Street East of the middle of the block between 12th Street and 13th Streets: (8) the first parking space located on the South side of "L" Street West of the intersection with 13th Street; (9) the first parking space located on the West side of 13th Street North of the intersection with "K" Street; (10) the first parking space located on the East side of 13th Street South of the intersection with "L" Street; (11) the first parking space located on the North side of "L" Street East of the intersection with 13th Street; (12) the first parking space located on the East side of 13th Street North of the middle of the block between "M" Street and "L" Streets; (13) the first parking space located on the West side of 13th Street North of the intersection with "M" Street; and (14) the first parking space located on the North side of "M" Street West of the middle of the block between 12th and 13th Streets, Aurora, Nebraska.
