AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 1110, THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF AURORA, NEBRASKA, BY AMENDING THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS OF ARTICLE FOUR: SECTION 413, C1 CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT, SUBSECTION 413.03, PERMITED ACCESSORY USES AND STRUCTURES; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND SECTIONS; TO ORDER THE ORDINANCE PUBLISHED IN BOOK, PAMPHLET, OR ELECTRONIC FORM; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AURORA, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Ordinance 1110, the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Aurora, Nebraska, Article Four, be amended as follows:

Article Four, Section 413, Subsection 413.03, shall be amended to read as follows:

413.03 PERMITTED ACCESSORY USES AND STRUCTURES:

- 1. Outdoor display of merchandise, provided such display shall not be interpreted as meaning the storage, stockpiling, or warehousing of materials which are not immediately available for purchase.
- 2. Residential dwelling units (internal or attached), including small and medium group homes, on the first floor in the rear of the building or on the second or higher floors, physically separated from the primary use of the structure, regardless of ownership.
- 3. Accessory uses and structures customarily associated with and incidental to the principal uses.
- Section 2. That all other resolutions and ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage, approval, and publication or posting of this ordinance, and in conflict with its provisions, are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval, and publication or posting as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1222

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 1110, THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF AURORA, NEBRASKA, BY AMENDING THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS OF ARTICLE FOUR: SECTION 413, CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT, SUBSECTION 413.04, CONDITIONAL USES AND STRUCTURES AND SECTION 421, USE REGULATION MATRIX; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND SECTIONS; TO ORDER THE ORDINANCE PUBLISHED IN BOOK, PAMPHLET, OR ELECTRONIC FORM; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AURORA, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Ordinance 1110, the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Aurora, Nebraska, Article Four, be amended as follows:

Article Four, Section 413, Subsection 413.04, shall be amended to read as follows:

413.04 CONDITIONAL USES AND STRUCTURES:

After the provisions of Article 7 of this Ordinance relating to conditional uses have been met, the following uses may be allowed as conditional uses:

- 1. Other office, business and commercial service uses, determined at the sole discretion of the Commission, to be comparable with the other uses permitted as conditional uses in this district, compatible with the uses permitted in the district and consistent with the intent of this district, provided that a sexually oriented business, as defined in Section 524 of this Ordinance, shall not be considered comparable and compatible with other uses or consistent with the intent of this district. (Section 413, amended September 13, 2016, by Ord. 1037)
- 2. Communications, microwave, cellular communications or other non-wind energy towers in excess of thirty-five (35) feet in height, all subject to the applicable provisions of any Airport Hazard regulations, provided that such towers shall be separated from the property line of any residentially zoned property (including R-1, ,R-R and R/O) by a distance of one hundred fifty (150) feet, and comply with all applicable provisions of Section 420 of this Ordinance, which is the AHO, Airport Hazard Overlay District, including a maximum elevation of 1,946.9 feet above mean sea level.

3. Contractor/Trade shops, cabinet, plumbing, electrical, HVAC, or sheet metal shops located no less than one block from the downtown square, provided it complies with the performance standards established for zoning district I-1 at all times.

Article Four, Section 421, Line item 61, shall be amended to read as follows:
